



## Aetna's Claim Explanation of Benefits (EOB) Tool

Get your EOBs faster than through the mail

You can now get your Explanation of Benefits (EOB) statements electronically with our online Claim EOB Tool. It's available at [www.aetnadental.com](http://www.aetnadental.com). With this useful tool, you can get your daily list of EOB statements online in PDF format. You can either print the statements or save them to your computer. The tool will also enable you to:

- Access a daily list of EOBs by tax ID number/provider ID number (TIN/PIN).
- Search for any claim EOB.
- Produce and print an EOB statement for a completed, pending or denied claim.
- Get the most from your electronic remittance advice (ERA) and/or electronic funds transfer (EFT) transactions. Use the payment ID/trace number in your ERA/EFT file to access the corresponding EOB.

### Getting started

Access [www.aetnadental.com](http://www.aetnadental.com) to register for or log in to our secure provider website. Choose the "View Explanation of Benefits" link. From there, click on the "Claim EOB Tool." It offers these three functions:

- **EOB activity** — on this page, you'll see a list of TINs with new EOB activity, as well as the dates of the EOB.
- **EOB search** — here you'll be able to search for the EOBs you are looking for. You can search by claim, patient, payment or provider. Enter the payment ID/trace number from your ERA or EFT in the "Search by Payment" tab.
- **Claim search** — search by claim.

## Tips and troubleshooting

### Reconciling EFT payments to your electronic EOBs

- Use the “Search by Payment” tab.
- The TIN should already be displayed, or you can select another TIN from the drop-down box.
- If you have access to view all EOBs, don’t select the PIN from the PIN field. Selecting the PIN will limit your search to the PIN selected.
- If your bank supplies the trace number/check number, you may enter up to five trace numbers/check numbers here. This is the most direct search option and will return the EOB you are looking for.
  - Example trace numbers — 813152410009999 (non-HMO) or 160601130099999 (HMO)
- If you’re performing a search using the “Payment Date” span, be sure to enter a date range of at least five business days prior to the EFT deposit date to locate your EOB.
  - For example, if you are looking for a deposit dated 7/21/2013, your search criteria should be at least 7/15/2013 through 7/21/2013. The system will return all EOBs from the date span you’ve entered. You can’t search by just using the current date.
- Once you’ve entered your search criteria, click the “Submit” button.
- After finding your EOB, you can view, print or download it to your computer.

If you’re enrolled in ERA and we’ve started an overpayment recovery, you can use the Claim EOB Tool to get the patient information that corresponds to the recovery by retrieving that particular EOB.
